## THE PUBLIC BENEFITS ORGANIZATIONS ACT (No. 18 of 2013)

**IN EXERCISE** of the powers conferred by section 69(1) of the Public Benefits Organizations Act, the Cabinet Secretary for Interior and National Administration makes the following Regulations—

### THE PUBLIC BENEFITS ORGANIZATIONS REGULATIONS, 2025

### PART I -PRELIMINARY

Citation.	1. These Regulations may be cited as the Public Benefits

Objects of these Regulations.	3. The Objects of these Regulations shall be to provide—
	(a) a framework for the management and oversight of

public benefits organizations;

- (b) the criteria for registration, suspension, cancellation and reinstatement of public benefit organizations; and
- (c) for the coordination and -operations of the forums and federation of forums.

#### PART II — PRE-REQUISITES FOR REGISTRATION AS A PUBLIC BENEFIT ORGANIZATION

Search and reservation of name.

**4.**(1) A person seeking to register a public benefit organization shall, in writing, apply to the Authority for a search on the availability of the proposed name of the public benefit organization.

(2) An application under sub-regulation (1) shall be contain at least three proposed names of the public benefit organization and be accompanied by the fee set out in the First Schedule.

(3) Upon receipt of the application under sub-regulation (1), the Authority shall conduct a search on the proposed name of the public benefit organization and where the search is —

 (a) successful, reserve the available proposed name pending registration of the public benefit organization; or

(b) unsuccessful, notify the applicant indicating the reasons thereof.

(4) The reservation of a name under sub-regulation (3) shall be valid for a period of sixty days unless the applicant applies for an extension of reservation.

(5) A person seeking an extension of reservation of name under sub-regulation (4) shall, in writing apply to the Authority indicating the reasons thereof.

(6) Upon receipt of the application under sub-regulation(5), the Authority shall, where the application is —

- (a) approved, extend the reservation of the available proposed name for a further period not exceeding sixty days; or
- (b) rejected, notify the applicant indicating the reasons thereof.

Prohibited names. **5.** The Authority shall not register a public benefit organization by a particular name if—

- (a) the name is similar to a name used by another public benefit organization;
- (b) the use of the name would constitute an offence under the Act or any other written law;
- (c) in the opinion of the Authority, the name is offensive or undesirable; or
- (d) in the opinion of the Authority, the name is likely to give the impression that the public benefit organization is connected to a state organ, a county government or any other public entity.

**6.** (1) The purpose and activities of a public benefit organization may be deemed to be for public benefit if—

- (a) the public benefit activity is as defined under section 2 of the Act;
- (b) the purpose and activities fall within the categories specified in the Sixth Schedule to the Act;
- (c) the beneficiaries of the purposes and activities of the organisation are identifiable;
- (d) the benefit is directly related to and is not incidental to the public benefit purpose;
- (e) the benefits and activities do not offer private benefit to the office bearers or directors of an organisation or any immediate family member or

Public benefit test.

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close business associate of an office bearer or directors of an organization; and

(f) where there is more than one charitable purpose, the one purpose shall not be used to offset any lack of public benefit in another.

(2) A public benefit organization may define the class of persons eligible to benefit from its charitable purpose by reference to—

- (a) persons with a particular public benefit need; or
- (b) reasonable geographical restrictions,

Provided that the geographical restriction is not too narrowly defined in relation to the charitable purpose.

#### PART III — REGISTRATION OF NATIONAL PUBLIC BENEFIT ORGANIZATION

**7.** A group of persons shall not operate as a national public benefit organization unless—

(a) its demonstrates that is has been or seeks to engage in a public benefit activity; and

(b) it is registered in accordance with the Act and these Regulations.

**8.** (1) An application for registration of a national public benefit organization shall be made to the Authority—

- (a) in the Form 1 set out in the Second Schedule;
- (b) accompanied by the fee specified in the First Schedule;
- (c) accompanied by-

- (i) the constitution of the public benefit organization as specified under section 8(4) of the Act;
- (ii) a copy of the proposed name of the public benefit organization reserved under regulation 5;
- (iii) the minutes of the meeting specifying the agreement to register;
- (iv) the particulars of the office bearers or directors of the public benefit organization, a third of whom must be Kenyan nationals and resident in Kenya;
- (v) details of the physical address and postal address of the organization; and
- (vi) any other relevant information.

(2) Pursuant to section 9 of the Act, within sixty days of receipt of the application under sub-regulation (1), the Authority shall make a determination of the application and may, where the application is—

(a) approved, issue a certificate of registration in Form 2 set out in Second Schedule; or

(b) rejected, notify the applicant in writing indicating the reasons for rejection within fourteen days of making its determination.

#### PART IV — BESTOWMENT OF PUBLIC BENEFIT ORGANIZATION STATUS

**9.** An organization shall qualify for bestowment of public benefit organization status if the organization—

(a) is an entity incorporated in accordance with any other relevant law in Kenya;

Eligibility for bestowment of public benefit organization status.

- (b) the entity is in good standing with its respective registering authority;
- (c) has been operating in or from Kenya for at least one year prior to seeking bestowment under this Act;
- (d) has been undertaking a public benefit activity within the categories specified in the Sixth Schedule to the Act.

Application for bestowment of public benefit status.

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**10.** (1) An application for bestowment of public benefit status shall be made to the Authority—

- (a) in Form 3 set out in the Second Schedule;
- (b) accompanied by the fee specified in the First Schedule;
- (c) accompanied by-

(i) the constituting document of the entity;

- (ii) the certificate of registration of the entity issued by the relevant registration authority;
- (iii) a copy of the proposed name of the public benefit organization reserved under regulation 5;
- (iv) the minutes of the meeting specifying the agreement to register;
- (v) the particulars of the office bearers or directors of the public benefit organization, a third of whom must be Kenyan nationals and resident in Kenya; and
- (vi) the details of the physical address and

postal address of the organization.

(2) Within sixty days of receipt of the application under sub-regulation (1), the Authority shall make a determination of the application in accordance with section 9 of the Act and may, where the application is—

- (a) approved, issue a certificate of bestowment in Form 4 set out in Second Schedule; or
- (b) rejected, notify the applicant in writing indicating the reasons for rejection within fourteen days of making its determination.

#### PART V — REGISTRATION OF INTERNATIONAL PUBLIC BENEFIT ORGANIZATION

Registration of international organizations

Eligibility for registration as an international public benefit organization. **11.** (1) Pursuant to section 11(3), an organization that seeks to—

(a) directly implement any activities or programmes, in or from Kenya;

(b) raise any subscriptions in or from Kenya; or

(c) engage in any other form of fundraising activities in or from Kenya,

may be registered as an international organization.

(2) An organization may be registered as an international public benefit organization if the organization—

- (a) is a body corporate entity and registered in accordance with the relevant law of its country of original registration;
- (b) is in good standing with its respective registering authority;

- (c) has been operating in the country of original registration at least three years prior to seeking registration in Kenya under this Act; and
- (d) has been undertaking an activity that is falls within the definition of public benefit activity in any of the categories specified in the Sixth Schedule to the Act.

**12.** (1) An application for registration of an international public benefit organization shall be made to the Authority—

- (a) in Form 5 set out in the Second Schedule;
- (b) accompanied by the fee specified in the First Schedule;
- (c) accompanied by-

(i) the constituting document of the organization;

 (ii) the certificate of registration of the entity issue by the relevant registration authority in their country of original registration;

- (iii) a copy of the proposed name of the public benefit organization reserved under regulation 5;
- (iv) the minutes of the meeting specifying the agreement to register;
- (v) the particulars of the office bearers, one third of whom must be Kenyan nationals and resident in Kenya;
- (vi) a document indicating the source of the funding of the organization;

Application for registration as an international public benefit organization.

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- (vii) the details of the physical address and postal address of the organization; and
- (viii) a duly signed attendance list with telephone numbers and personal identification numbers of the members present at the meeting.

(2) Within sixty days of receipt of the application under sub-regulation (1), the Authority shall make a determination of the application in accordance with section 6 of the Act and may, where the application is—

- (a) approved, issue a certificate of registration in Form 6 set out in Second Schedule; or
- (b) rejected, notify the applicant in writing indicating the reasons for rejection within fourteen days of making its determination.

Exemption from registration as an international organization

Eligibility for exemption from registration as an international public benefit organization. **13.** (1) Pursuant to section 11(2) of the Act, an organization that does not intend to directly implement any activities in or from Kenya shall apply for exemption from registration as an international organization.

(2) The indirect implementation of activities envisaged under sub-regulation (1) shall include—

- (a) collaborating with local partners and stakeholders to achieve its objectives in Kenya;
- (b) providing financial grants or assistance to local partners to enable them to achieve their objectives in and from Kenya;
- (c) providing policy guidance to ensure effective delivery by implementing partners and service providers;

- (d) active involvement in the planning, managing, and delivering of activities and programmes;
- (e) using the staff, officers and other staff and infrastructure belonging to the implementing organization in the delivery of activities and programmes; or
- (f) providing technical assistance to other organizations registered in Kenya to support the achievement of their public benefit activities.

(3) An organization may be exempted from registration under sub-regulation (1) if the organization—

- (a) is a body corporate entity and duly registered in accordance with the relevant law of their country of origin;
- (b) is in good standing with its respective registering authority;
- (c) has been operating in the country of origin for at least three years prior to seeking registration in Kenya under this Act;

 (d) has been undertaking an activity that is falls within the definition of public benefit activity in any of the categories specified in the Sixth Schedule to the Act.

**14.** (1) An application for exemption from registration as an international public benefit organization shall be made to the Authority—

- (a) in Form 7 set out in the Second Schedule;
- (b) accompanied by the fee specified in the First Schedule;
- (c) accompanied by-

Application for exemption from registration as an international public benefit organization.

- (i) the constituting document of the organization;
- (ii) the certificate of registration of the entity issue by the relevant registration authority in their Country;
- (iii) a copy of the proposed name of the public benefit organization reserved under regulation 5;
- (iv) the minutes of the meeting specifying the agreement to register;
- (v) the particulars of the office bearers, one of who must be Kenyan national resident in Kenya;
- (vi) the postal address and physical address of the organization;

(vii) a document indicating the source of the funding of the organization; and

(viii) particulars of the authorized agent of the public benefits organization.

(2) Within sixty days of receipt of the application under sub-regulation (1), the Authority shall make a determination of the application in accordance with section 9 of the Act and may, where the application is—

- (a) approved, issue a permit in Form 8 set out in Second Schedule; or
- (b) rejected, notify the applicant in writing indicating the reasons for rejection within fourteen days of making its determination.

**15.** In addition to the requirements of section 11(5) of the Act, upon registration of an organization under this Part, the international organization shall—

Effect of registration.

- (a) comply with the obligations of a public benefit organization specified under the Act and any other relevant law;
- (b) be eligible to access any right or benefit that may accrue to a public benefit organization under this Act.

#### PART VI —CANCELLATION OR SUSPENSION OF REGISTRATION

Suspension or cancellation of registration.

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**16.** (1) A certificate of registration or a permit issued under these Regulations may be cancelled or suspended by the Authority on the grounds specified in section 18 and 19 of the Act.

(2) Without prejudice to the generality of sub-regulation(1), the Authority may cancel or suspend the registration of an organization where—

 (a) the members or directors of the organization fail to comply with the requirements of constituting document of the organization;

(b) the organization fails to comply with the obligations of registered public benefit organization provided under the Act or these Regulations;

- (c) the organization breaches the terms or conditions of a certificate registration or permit of registration;
- (d) the organization submits a false representation in any document or a narrative to the Authority; or
- (e) the public benefit organization is no longer undertaking a public benefit activity.

(3) Before cancellation or suspension of a certificate of registration, the Authority shall issue the organization with a notice to show cause in Form 9 or 10 set out in the First

Schedule requiring a justification why the registration should not be cancelled or suspended.

(4) Where the Authority cancels or suspends the registration of a public benefit organization pursuant to section 18 and 19 of the Act, the Authority shall—

- (a) strike the public benefit organization's name off the Register;
- (b) at least once in every year and in accordance with section 15(6) of the Act, publish a notice in the *gazette* and the website of the Authority, indicating the name of the public benefit organization that has been struckoff from the Register.

(5) Notwithstanding the provisions of this regulation, the name of a public benefit organization that is cancelled under sub-regulation (1), shall be reserved for a period of thirty days, thereafter the name shall be available for registration.

Cancellation of permit.

**17.** A permit issued in accordance with regulation 14(2) of these Regulations may be cancelled where the organization—

(a) directly implements its activities or programmes directly in Kenya;

- (b) indirectly implements activities that are not public benefit activities; or
- (c) engages directly with beneficiaries of an activity or programme;
- (d) fails to comply with the Act or these Regulations.

Restrictions upon suspension.

**18.** Where the certificate of registration of a public benefit organization has been suspended under regulation 18, the public benefit organization shall not—

(a) withdraw funds from the bank account or other

the financial kitty of the organization;

- (b) expand its activities or initiate a new project or investments;
- (c) borrow funds or lend funds to any person or institution:
- (d) dispose of the assets of the organization;
- (e) renew or replace its registration certificate;
- (f) amend its register or change the particulars of the office bearers or directors or membership; and
- (g) engage in new investments including purchase of assets.

#### Restoration upon cancellation.

**19.** (1) Where a public benefit organization's registration is cancelled under regulation 16 or 17, the Authority may, on its own motion or on application by a public benefit organization, restore a public benefit organization to the Register of public benefit organizations where-

- (a) the cancellation of the registration of the public benefit organization was erroneous;
- (b) the public benefit organization has complied with the reasons for cancellation; or
- (c) the Authority is of the opinion that the public benefit organization should be restored.

(2) An application for restoration upon cancellation of a public benefit organization shall be made to the Authority in Form 10 set out in the Second Schedule.

under sub-regulation (2), the Authority shall make a determination of the application and may where the application is-

(a) approved, restore the registration of the public

(3) Within fourteen days of receipt of the application

benefit organization;

(b) rejected, notify the applicant indicating the reasons for the rejection.

(4) The Authority shall, by notice in the *gazette* and on the website of the Authority, publish the list of organizations restored under this regulation pursuant to section 15(6) of the Act indicating—

- (a) the date from which the restoration takes effect;
- (b) the name of the organization and, if the organization's name is restored to the Register under a different name, the former name of the organization; and
- (c) any other relevant information.

Reinstatement upon suspension.

**20.** (1) An application for review of the decisions upon suspension of a public benefit organization, shall be made to the Authority in Form 11 set out in the Second Schedule.

(2) Within fourteen days of receipt of the application under sub-regulation (1), the Authority shall make a determination of the application and may where the application is—

- (a) approved, reinstate the public benefit organization;
- (b) rejected, notify the applicant indicating the reasons for the rejection.

(3) The Authority shall, at least once every year and by notice in the *gazette* and on the website of the Authority, publish a list of organizations reinstated under this regulation in the indicating—

- (a) the date from which the reinstatement takes effect;
- (b) the name of the organization; and

(c) any other relevant information.

#### PART VII- RECOGNITION OF FORUMS AND FEDERATION OF FORUMS

**21.** (1) Pursuant to section 23 of the Act, an organization registered under these Regulations may join and maintain membership in a self-regulation forum of registered public benefit organizations.

(2) A forum of may be recognised as a self-regulating forum for purposes of the Act if the forum—

- (a) consist of at least ten public benefit organizations;
- (b) engage in related activities from the categories specified in the Sixth Schedule.

Application for recognition of a forum of public benefit organizations.

**22.**(1) An application for recognition of a forum shall be made to the Authority

(a) in the Form 12 set out in the Second Schedule;

- (b) accompanied by the fee specified in the First Schedule.
- (c) accompanied by—
  - (i) the constituting document of the forum;
  - (ii) a copy of the reserved name of the forum;
  - (iii) proof of the geographical spread of the forum
  - (iv) the minutes of the meeting where the resolution to form a forum was passed signed by the office bearers or directors of the constituting organizations;

- (v) the minutes of the meeting of the constituting public benefit organizations where the resolution to join the forum;
- (vi) the particulars of the office bearers of the forum;
- (vii) the certificates of registration of the organizations intending to join the forum; and

(viii) a code of conduct and standards.

(2) Within sixty days of receipt of the application under sub-regulation (1), the Authority shall make a determination of the application and may, where the application is—

- (a) approved, issue a certificate of recognition in Form 13 set out in Second Schedule; or
- (b) rejected, notify the applicant in writing indicating the reasons for rejection within fourteen days of making its determination.

Eligibility for recognition of a federation of forums. **23.** (1) Pursuant to section 24(2) of the Act, a forum may join a forum of forums of registered public benefit organizations.

(2) A federation of forums may be recognized federation of forum for purposes of the Act if the federation—

- (a) consist of at least five forums of public benefit organizations;
- (b) engage in related activities from the categories specified in the Sixth Schedule.

**24.**(1) An application for recognition of a federation of forums shall be made to the Authority—

Application for

(a) in the Form 14 set out in the Second Schedule;

- (b) accompanied by the fee specified in the First Schedule.
- (c) accompanied by—
  - (i) the constituting document of the federation;
  - (ii) a copy of the reserved name of the federation;
  - (iii) evidence of the geographical spread of the forum
  - (iv) the minutes of the meeting where the resolution to form a federation was passed;
  - (v) the minutes of the meeting of the constituting public benefit organizations where the resolution to join the forum;

(vi) the particulars of the office bearers;

(vii) the certificates of recognition of the forums intending to join the federation; and

(viii) a code of conduct.

(2) Within sixty days of receipt of the application under sub-regulation (1), the Authority shall make a determination of the application and may, where the application is—

- (a) approved, issue a recognition certificate in Form 15 set out in Second Schedule; or
- (b) rejected, notify the applicant indicating the reasons for rejection.

#### PART VIII— OBLIGATIONS AND MATERIAL CHANGES IN A PUBLIC BENEFIT ORGANIZATIONS

Records to be

25. (1) A public benefit organization shall keep up-to-

Annual returns.	<b>26.</b> (1) Within six months at the end of each calendar year, every public benefit organization shall prepare and submit to the Authority the annual returns of the organization.
	(2) The annual returns shall be—

Other inquiries.	<b>27.</b> (1) Without prejudice to the provisions of section 63 of the Act, the Authority may conduct other inquiries on a public benefit organization in respect of—
	(a) any breach or non-compliance with the requirements of the Act and these Regulations;
	(b) any irregularity in the manner of the conduct of the affairs of the public benefit organization; or

(c) any individuals responsible for the irregularities unveiled by the inquiry.

(2) Upon conclusion of an inquiry under sub-regulation (1), the Authority may put in place such measures or take such action as may be necessary to ensure compliance with the Act.

Material changes.

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**28.** (1) Where a public benefit organization effects a material change in the organization, the organization shall notify the Authority of the change.

(2) The changes envisaged under sub-regulation (1) include any changes in—

- (a) the areas of public benefit activity set out in the Sixth Schedule which the public benefit organization is registered or bestowed to undertake;
- (b) the categories of activities that the public benefit organization engages in;
- (c) the constitution or other constitutive document of the organization;
- (d) the composition of the governing body of the organization;
- (e) the particulars of the director, office bearers of the organization;
- (f) the physical address or postal address of its principal place of operation;
- (g) the banking arrangements of a public benefit organization;
- (h) the authorized agent in the case of an international organization; or
- (i) any other relevant information as may be specified by the Authority.
- (3) A notification of a material change under this

regulation shall be made to the Authority—

(a) in Form 17 set out in the Second Schedule;

(b) accompanied by—

- (i) the minutes of the meeting passing the resolution in relation to the change duly signed by the director of the organization;
- (ii) evidence justifying the reasons for the change in the public benefit organization.
- (iii) the fee set out in the Second Schedule.

(4) A notification under this regulation shall be made—

- (a) in the case of a change in the membership of the governing body of an organization, within one month of any appointment or election of the member;
- (b) in the case a change in the particulars provided during registration under these regulations, within thirty days of the occurrence of the change; and

(c) in the case of any other change, within thirty days of the occurrence of the change.

(5) Within sixty days of receipt of the notification under sub-regulation (3), the Authority shall consider the application and may where the application is-

- (a) approved, effect the change in the public benefit organization and notify the applicant of the decision:
- (b) rejected, notify the applicant in writing indicating the reasons for the rejection.

Change of name 29.(1) A public benefit organization may change its of a public name organization.

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benefit

- (a) by a resolution passed in accordance with its constitution;
- (b) under the direction of the Authority or
- (c) by an order of the Court.

(2) Where the public benefit organization passes a resolution for change of name, the organization shall lodge with the Authority a notice of change of name in Form 18 set out in the Second Schedule accompanied by—

- (a) the minutes of the meeting where the resolution to change the name was passed;
- (b) the reasons for the resolution to change the name; and
- (c) the fee set out in the First Schedule.

(3) Within fourteen days of receipt of the application under sub-regulation (2), the Authority shall make a determination of the application and may where the application is—

(a) approved, effect the change of name of the organization and issue a certificate of change of name in Form 19 set out in the Second Schedule;

(b) rejected, notify the applicant indicating the reasons for the rejection.

(4) The Authority may direct a public benefit organization to change its name if—

- (a) the name is too similar to a name appearing in the Register of public benefit organizations; or
- (b) the name was registered erroneously.

(5) Where the Authority orders a change of name under regulation (4), the Authority shall, in writing—

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- (a) notify the public benefit organization of the proposed change of name within fourteen days;
- (b) give the public benefit organization an opportunity to be heard including providing an alternative name for the public benefit organization;
- (c) specify the period within which the public benefit organization is to comply with the direction

(6) Upon completion of the procedure under regulation(5), the Authority may where the application is approved—

- (a) change the name of the public benefit organisation name and issue a certificate of change of name in Form 18 set out in the Second Schedule; or
- (b) strike off the organization from the Register.

(7) Where the Court orders a change of name, the Authority shall effect the change of name in accordance with sub-regulation (6).

(8) The Authority shall, at least once every year and by notice in the *gazette* and on the website of the Authority, publish a list of public benefit organizations that have changed their name under this regulation specifying—

(a) the date from which the change of name takes

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- (b) the name of the organization; and
- (c) any other relevant information.

**30.** (1) Where a change of name has been effected under regulation 29, the change of name shall—

effect:

- (a) have effect from the date on which the certificate of change of name is issued;
- (b) not affect any rights or obligations of the public



benefit organization;

- (c) not affect the ownership of any assets or other property vested in the public benefit organization;
- (d) not affect any liabilities enforceable by the public benefit organization; and
- (e) not invalidate any legal proceedings by or against the public benefit organization.

(2) Any legal proceedings that might have been continued or commenced against the public benefit organization by its former name may be continued or commenced under its new name.

#### PART IX — DISSOLUTION AND DEREGISTRATION OF A PUBLIC BENEFIT ORGANIZATION

**31.**(1) A public benefit organization may dissolve itself voluntarily in the manner specified under section 61 of the Act.

(2) A public benefit organization that passes a resolution for voluntary dissolution shall notify the Authority in Form 20 set out in the Second Schedule within fourteen days of making a decision to dissolve.

(3) A notification under sub-regulation (2) shall be signed by at least two-thirds of the members and be accompanied by—

- (a) the certificate of registration of the public benefit organization;
- (b) the public benefit organization intention to be voluntarily dissolved
- (c) a copy of the minutes and the resolution of the meeting recommending the dissolution of the public benefit organization; and
- (d) the reasons for the resolution to voluntarily

Voluntary dissolution of an organization. dissolve;

(4) Upon receiving the notice under subsection (2), the Authority shall ensure—

- (a) the notice is in accordance with the constitution of the public benefit organization;
- (b) the safety of assets under this regulation is guaranteed.

Deregistration of an organization by the Authority.

**32.** (1) The Authority may deregister a public benefit organization where the public benefit organization -

- (a) has failed to comply with this Act or these regulations;
- (b) is suspected to be engaged in activities involving money laundering or other economic crimes;
- (c) has contravened other laws in Kenya;
- (d) has failed to undertake a public benefit purpose for a period of one year.

(2) Where the Authority orders for the deregistration of a public benefit organisation under sub-regulation (1), the Authority shall, in writing—

- (a) notify the public benefit organization of the decision within fourteen days of making its determination;
- (b) give the public benefit organization an opportunity to be heard and rectify the failure;
- (c) specify the period within which the public benefit organization is to comply with the order.

(3) Where the organization has not complied with the direction of the Authority under sub-regulation (2)(c), the

Authority shall deregister the public benefit organization.

Deregistration of an organization by Court. **33.** Where the Court orders the deregistration of a public benefit organization, the Authority shall effect the order to deregister the organization in accordance with regulation 32.

Effect of dissolution or deregistration.

**34.** Where a public benefit organization is dissolved or deregistered under this Part, the Authority shall —

- (a) strike off the public benefit organization from the Register; and
- (b) publish a notice at least once every year in the *gazette* and on the website of the Authority, that the public benefit organization has been voluntarily dissolved or deregistered.

Safeguarding of assets.

RAF

**35.**(1) Where a public benefit organization intends to voluntarily dissolve or wind itself up or cancel its registration, the public benefit organization shall submit to the Authority—

 (a) notice of voluntary deregistration, dissolution or winding up;

 (b) the resolution of the governing body identifying the public benefit organization where assets may be transferred;

- (c) a list of all liabilities of the organization;
- (d) a list of all assets of the organization;
- (e) a list of organization's registered under this Act with similar objectives.

(2) A public benefit organization with outstanding liabilities shall not be dissolved until its liabilities are met and paid up.

(3) The assets of a public benefit organization that intends to voluntarily dissolve, deregister or wound up shall be transferred to a public benefit organization certified by the Authority to be in good standing.

(4) A public benefit organization deregistered under this regulation shall not dispose its assets without the approval of the Authority.

#### PART X — MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS

Engaging in economic activities.

**36.** (1) Pursuant to section 65 of Act, a public benefit organization may engage in lawful economic activities to support the public benefit purposes for which the organization was established.

(2) When engaging in economic activity as envisaged under sub-regulation (1), a public benefit organization shall ensure that—

- (a) it is licensed or authorised by the relevant regulatory authority to engage in the respective economic activity;
- (b) it operates in the best interests of the organization;
- (c) it applies good financial and business practices to avoid exposing the organisation to undue risk;
- d) the proceeds of the economic activity are solely used to advance the public benefit activity for which it was registered.

Replacement and certified copies of certificates of registration. **37.** (1) The Authority may issue a replacement certificate for any certificate of registration or permit that is lost, defaced or damaged.

(2) An application for replacement of a certificate or permit under sub-regulation (1) shall be made in writing to the Authority accompanied by the fee set out in the Second Schedule.

(3) Within thirty days of receipt of an application under this regulation, the Authority shall make a determination of the application and where the application is—

- (a) approved, issue a duplicate or certified copy of the certificate of registration or a permit; or
- (b) rejected, notify the applicant in writing indicating the reasons thereof.


